

New Refrigerated Truck Fuels WAFER Food Pantry Mission



WAFER's mission is to "provide food and work to eliminate hunger." Our services aim to offer nutritious and well-balanced food options, especially fresh items that often exceed the budget of our shoppers.

We are thrilled to announce the acquisition of a new refrigerated truck to further our mission and care for our friends and neighbors. After a nearly two-year acquisition process, the truck arrived on the last day of 2024. This vehicle will enable the safe transport of perishable items, such as those donated by generous community partners through our "Retail Recovery" program. Annually, more than 1,000,000 pounds of food are rescued from retail partners. More detailed information about our retail partners can be found on our website.

This acquisition, made possible through generous support, underscores our collective commitment to addressing food insecurity in our region and providing balanced, nutritious meals to our community. An Update On Ava . . .

You may remember Ava from the last newsletter. The family relied on WAFER while they navigated an unexpected move as Ava awaited a critical surgery. I am thrilled to report that Ava and her family are now settled into their new home <u>and</u> Ava came through surgery like a champion. Your financial support and food donations made sure Ava and her family were cared for during one of the most tumultuous situations in their life. I am deeply grateful for you, and so is Ava!

Navigating Uncertainty...

In recent years, changes to government and foundation policies and funding priorities have created significant unpredictability for nonprofit organizations. WAFER's leadership have diligently monitoring these changes to adapt quickly and ensure no disruptions to our community. In full transparency, several areas are of current concern - promised federal reimbursements for funds already spent, proposed cuts to nutrition programs that would increase reliance on emergency food outlets, and proposed reductions to supplemental food programs. We kindly ask you to stay informed about these challenges and for your continued financial support.

Program Update, Ensuring No Child Goes Hungry . . .

For more than a decade, food insecure children have benefited from our "Backpack" program, which provides already-prepared foods to take home on weekends or extended breaks. Research shows that food-insecure children face unique challenges such as developmental differences, poor academic performance, and chronic health and mental health conditions.

Our "Backpack" program ensures that students have access to food over the weekends, helping them return to school on Monday ready to learn. Your generous gifts make a significant difference for nearly 40 elementary students who receive a backpack of nutritious food each weekend. Your continued financial support is greatly appreciated. If you would also like to provide program specific foods, we could use individual servings of canned meals and soups, breakfast items, fruit and vegetable cups, and healthy snacks.

Looking Ahead . . .

The second Saturday in May is the annual **Letter Carriers Food Drive**, the nations largest one-day food drive. We look to our community to help restock the shelves prior to the start of summer, and this drive makes giving easy. If you would like to participate, have your non-expired shelf-stable foods out to your mailbox by 8am on Saturday, May 10th. Community volunteers and post office employees will come by to collect your items. That's it! Thank you for considering joining forces to make this event a success.
